Aims

The joint histological evaluation of specimens of Bladder and prostate cancer with neuroendocrine differentiation by the clinician and urologist can produce much more clinical and prognostic information than that contained in the final histopathology report. Both the clinician and urologist can benefit from such an approach. The former will more clearly understand and explain the preoperative features of the cancer, the intraoperative findings, and postoperative follow-up of the patient. The experience acquired would help improve him/her diagnostic and prognostication capabilities and surgical skill. The urologist will learn the great clinical significance of his/her daily routine. The course will be based on the projection and discussion of virtual slides and will focus on Epstein criteria for active surveillance and prostate cancer grading.
